

# Amend Constitution lassification of Mess Functions

Moved by Maj Priems to add the following paragraphs to immediately follow paragraph 15 of the Constitution and to renumber the subsequent paragraphs:

#### "CLASSIFICATION OF MESS FUNCTIONS

- 16. Functions in the VOM are defined as:
- a. Official Function. This shall mean a function that has been so designated by the BComd Kingston in accordance with references. These functions will be reflected on the VOM Entertainment Calendar. The attendance of all or specified Ordinary Members is obligatory unless excused by the applicable CO.
- b. Mess Function. This shall mean a function that is open to all Mess Members. These functions will be reflected on the VOM Entertainment Calendar. Attendance at such functions is encouraged;
- c. Unit or Private Function. This shall mean a function that is sponsored by a Mess Member, yet attended by those who have received an invitation only. Private Functions are not open to all Members of the Mess; and
- d. Outside Function. The CO VOM or PMC may authorize the use of the Mess by non-Members as a "business opportunity usually at the commercial rate with a Mess Member sponsoring the event. An Outside Function can include military personnel, whose Membership are outside the FFOM, or can include civilian personnel, who have entered into a lease agreement with the Mess, for the use of its facilities.
- 17. Membership Decorum at Unit/Private/Outside Functions: The Mess facilitates a large number of Member sponsored private functions and other outside functions that may impinge on the exclusive use of the Mess by its Members. Our membership should be aware that others may be using the Mess and every attempt should to be made not to conflict with the other users. Any concerns with repect to the Mess usage for these events should be brought to the PMC

Discussion: Capt McGean; asks about the dress code as it applies to outside functions. ENT O says that guests of these events are not held to the standards of the dress code. PMC details that for all the outside functions, the sponsor is responsible for the conduct of all those in attendance.

# Bylaw Amendment – **\*\*\* Mess Operations**



Moved by Major Geoff Priems to remove paragraphs 58 and 59 of the Bylaws replace them with the following paragraphs, with paragraph re-numbering as needed:

### "MESS OPERATIONS - USE OF VOM FACILITIES

- 58. Fees, terms and procedures for the reservation of the Mess facility for private or outside functions:
  - a. By a Mess Member. The facilities of the Mess are provided to Members of the Mess at no charge, provided their Mess account is in good standing. The Member hosting a personal function such as his/her wedding will not be charged a facility usage fee, but must pay for and cover all expenses such as food, napkins, staff wages, etc. Such functions shall be classified as Private Functions. The Mess Member, who wishes to support the wedding of his or her child, will be responsible for all costs including the rental of the Mess facility at a reduced rate (25% of the commercial rate). The ability to offer unlimited free access to the facilities for private functions is constrained by the number of Mess Members and the limited number of suitable venues. The PMC will monitor and adjudicate should conflict arise as a result of private function
  - b. By a Military, Non-Member. A Military officer who is not an Ordinary VOM Member may request to hire the facilities of the VOM provided they receive permission to do so from the PMC. A facility usage fee will be charged (50% of the commercial rate) for the portion of the Mess needed at the time of booking the facility. All costs associated with the conduct of the function are the personal responsibility of the non-Member.
  - c. By a Civilian, Non-Member. A Civilian non-Member may request to hire the facilities of the VOM provided they receive permission to do so from the PMC, pay the facility hire fee (commercial rate) for the portion of the Mess needed, and pay all costs associated with the conduct of the function. A member of the mess must sponsor the event and be responsible for all potential outstanding costs.. The PMC may authorize the use of the Mess as an "Outside Function" at commercial rates, to take advantage of a business opportunity.
- 59. Prior approval must be obtained in all circumstances to conduct a function that deviates from stipulated mess routine, such as bar hours and standards of dress and deportment.
- 60. A sponsoring member must be present during the function and will assume all responsibility for the behaviour of their guests. The sponsor is also responsible to ensure full payment is received for any function.
- 61. The PMC can waive or adjust fees to support an extraordinary requirement.

Ent O mentions that the cost of renting the Mess is currently much lower than market value.

# Bylaw 60 - Gift Fund



60. Gifts are traditionally presented to Ordinary Members when departing the Mess on posting or retirement. To defray the cost of such gifts, Ordinary Members will be assessed a monthly gift fund subscription in an amount to be determined from time to time, by the Mess Committee and approved by the membership at a GMM.

Moved by Maj Priems that:

•IAW bylaw 60, that the gift value upon posting is set at \$50 (set in 2023, with automatic increases in accordance with the DND Economic Model for Morale and Welfare Programs). Subject to availability and cost at the Military Communications and Electronics Museum, gifts may be selected from the following list of items:

# Bylaw 60 **Graduation Mess Dinner** Subsidy

..Student officers of VOM Training Establishments will be charged for the gift fund with the VOM subsidizing their graduation function held at the VOM on a per capita basis in the amount to be determined from time to time, by the Mess

· Moved by Maj Priems that:

IAW bylaw 60, that Graduation Mess Dinners for VOM Training Establishments have their dinner subsidized by **\$40 per diner** (set in 2023, with automatic increases in accordance with the DND Economic Model for Morale and Welfare Programs).

D BComd LCol Durant asks the two Schools if they can speak to how many grad dinners there are each fiscal year.

Maj McDonald answer that for CFSCE there are about 5 per year, 2 at 20 students each, and 3 at 40-50 students each. He also mentions that they pay mess dues while they are on course.

LCdr Reid answers that for CFSMI there are about 4 per year at 25-35 students, who also pay 5-6 months' worth of mess dues.

PMC says it averages out to be around \$10,000 per fiscal year.

# Bylaw 62 Retirement Gift

- 62. When an Ordinary Member retires from the Canadian Forces and is entitled to an annuity, he/she shall be given his/ her choice of an appropriate gift. The cost of the retirement gift is not to exceed an amount determined from time to time, by the Mess Committee and approved by the membership at a GMM.
- Moved by Mai Priems: that IAW bylaw 62, gift value upon retirement is set at \$100 (set in 2023, with automatic increases in accordance with the DND Economic Model for Morale and Welfare Programs). Subject to availability and cost at the Military Communications and Electronics Museum, gifts may be selected from the following list of items
  - a. Liar's Dice game Box (with engraving)
  - Medals Box (with engraving)
  - Medals Box with acrylic top (with engraving)
  - Mercury Statue Small (with engraving)
    Donation to C&E Museum (no tax receipt)
  - Flask Set Black with Rosewood Box (with engraving)



# New Bylaw: DWD Events

- Moved by Maj Priems:
- · To amend the Bylaws at para 43 to add the following:

"Depart with Dignity (DWD) events for members are defined as Entertainment Events, so long as they are booked 30 days in advance by an appropriate sponsor. The Mess will financially support such with costs of staff (including bar staff), and linens to a limit of \$250 per event. Set up and tear down is the responsibility of the organizer; and is subject to terms and conditions as made within the booking confirmation. It is understood that the retiring member may choose their quests, and may include members of other Messes and non-Members; under the responsibility of the event's sponsoring member."

# New Bylaw: Unit Allocations

- Moved by Maj Priems:
- At the end of the Bylaws a new Item be entered as follows:

"In order to foster greater unit morale and use of the VOM, as part of the Entertainment Budget, an amount per unit will be set that may be utilized by that Unit CO on their officers for Entertainment events held at the VOM. The minimum amount per unit is set at \$150. The amount per officer, and total amount per unit will be determined from time to time, by the Mess Committee and approved by the membership at a

In order to effectively control the funds, prior to expenditure Commanding Officers (or their delegate) must verify that the proposed expenditure of funds is in accordance with the intent of the Bylaw and NPP rules, through the Entertainment Officer.

PMC mentions that hosting DWDs at the Officers Mess is a hot topic, and that we want the Mess to be the premier venue for DWDs.

2Lt Williams asks if for the subsidized DWD if it would be just for officers or any member to host their DWD at the VOM? Ent O clarifies that it is just Members of the VOM who are hosting their DWD at the Mess who would qualify for the subsidy.

Someone identifies that that it should be specified what units are included in the bylaws.


