5. An officer designated by the Chief of the Defence Staff (CDS) and COs are authorized to order drug testing.

Who will order testing in the following situations?

1. There are reasonable grounds to believe that a CAF member has used a prohibited drug and it could be detected within a time period by urine testing.
2. A sample of urine will be provided, on an anonymous basis, to determine the prevalence of drug use in the CAF.
3. The member is undergoing an administrative program (C&P).
4. The member is in an occupation or a position designated as safety sensitive.
5. Testing is needed in the course of an investigation after an accident or an incident.
6. To discourage CAF members from using drugs, the units, elements and subdivisions are chosen at random to be tested.
