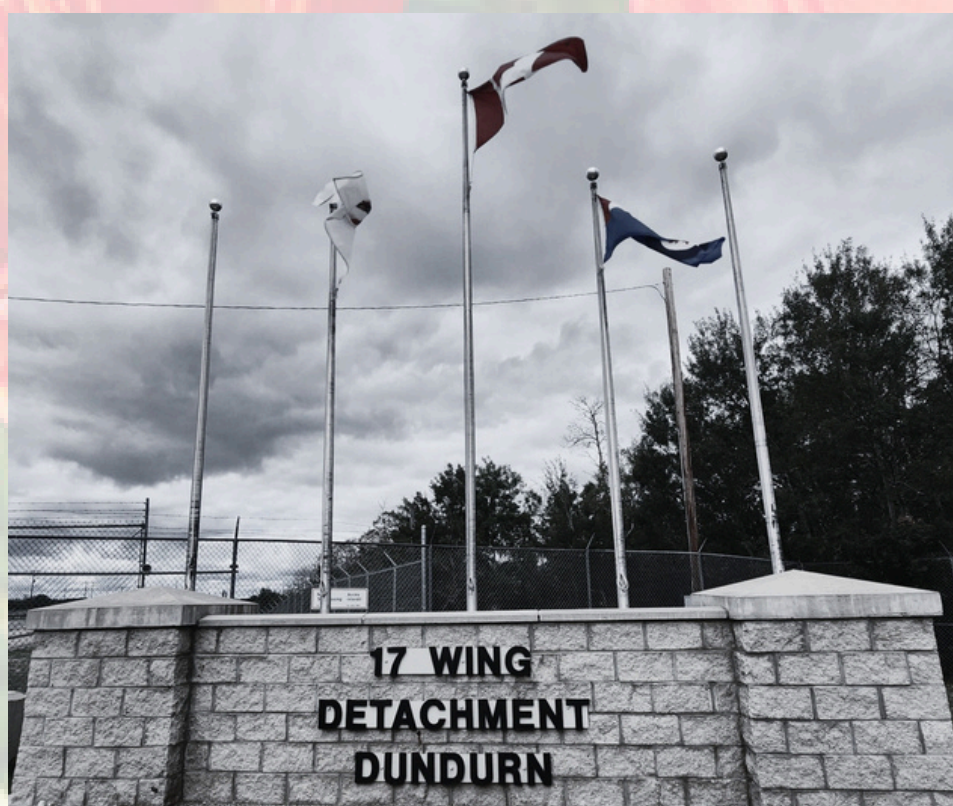

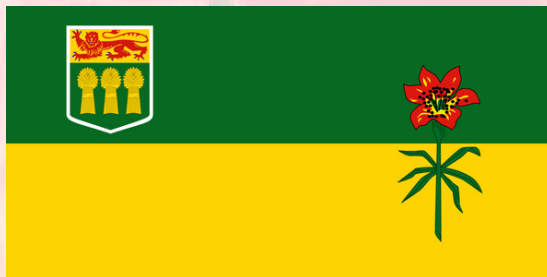

OUR AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY

Many of the postings within Central Saskatchewan are for 17 Wing Detachment Dundurn and the Canadian Forces Ammunition Depot; however, there are several reserve units within the city of Saskatoon, as well as a unit in Prince Albert and another in Yorkton. As a result, much of the information included in Marching On is directed towards families who will be residing in the areas of Dundurn and Saskatoon. Information on other communities within our catchment area can be provided to you if you contact our office and let us know what community you are being posted to.

ABOUT SASKATCHEWAN

- Saskatchewan is Canada's "sunniest" province, averaging from 2000 to 2500 hours of sunshine annually.
- Saskatchewan is on Central Standard Time year round. This means that we never change our clocks.
- The provincial tax rate in Saskatchewan is 6%.
- The name Saskatchewan derives from the Plains Indian word "kisiskatchewan" which means swiftly flowing river.
- More than half of Saskatchewan is covered by forest.



From the Detachment, traveling north on highway No. 11 for 42km, you will find yourself in the city of Saskatoon. Commonly referred to as the City of Bridges, Saskatoon is built on both sides of the South Saskatchewan River and is the fastest growing city in Saskatchewan. You will find shopping, activities, cultural and recreational choices, and anything else any other city will offer. DETACHMENT DUNDURN & CFAD

Canadian Forces Detachment Dundurn (also CFD Dundurn) is located 35km south of Saskatoon, 5km off highway No.11. The detachment is about 10km north of the small town of Dundurn. The population of Dundurn is approximately 675 people with limited services. Services available within the town of Dundurn are an elementary school (grades K-6), a community library, a gas station with basic grocery needs and an ATM, post office, sports center, community hall, churches, restaurants, two playgrounds and a few other basic services. Canadian Forces Ammunition Depot Dundurn (CFAD Dundurn) is classified as a lodger unit at CFD Dundurn and continues to function as an ammunition depot. CFAD Dundurn is the largest ammunition storage facility in the Canadian Forces, acting as the distribution center for both domestic and overseas deployments

MAPLE VIRTUAL HEALTH

Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services and Maple have collaborated to provide online doctor visits to dependents of Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members living in Canada. It is a safe and effective way to access routine healthcare from the comfort of your home.

With the click of a button, you can communicate with a Canadian-licensed general practitioner within minutes. You can access this by text, phone or video, from your smartphone, tablet or computer. Dependents of CAF members living in Canada are eligible. A valid CFOne card number is needed to confirm your eligibility for this program. If you are booking the appointment for a dependent child or your spouses, please use their CFOne number.

FAMILY CARE PLAN

A Family Care Plan is a mandatory Department of National Defence form that prepares families of Canadian Armed Forces members to be taken care of in case of unforeseen events, emergency callouts and planned deployment. By identifying primary and secondary caregivers who should be contacted in the event of an emergency or military tasking, your Family Care Plan supports your family in your absence. Essentially, the Family Care Plan is a regularly updated exchange of information between your family and a Commanding Officer. A completed Family Care Plan is designed to support individual and unit operational readiness.

All Canadian Armed Forces personnel must complete the Family Care Plan (FCP) Declaration DND Form 2886. It isn't a legally binding document, but it is kept on the military member's file. Family Care Plans are protected under the Privacy Act.

FAMILY INFORMATION LINE

The Family Information (FIL) is a confidential, personal, bilingual and free service offering information, support, referrals, reassurance and crisis management to the military community.

Why call or email the Family Information Line? Because they understand your military lifestyle. They have resources and want to support you. Their help is always free. They are there for you when it's tough and you just need to talk it out. They are also there to help you find answers to the questions that come up as a result of your military life.

INTERNET

Postal services are available in Dundurn and Hanley without a post office box number if you register a local physical address with the post office outlet. All mail will be delivered to "General Delivery."

EMERGENCY SERVICES

The detachment has all emergency first responder services. When calling for an emergency while on Detachment Dundurn (including PMQs), be sure to specify you are on detachment and not in the town of Dundurn to ensure appropriate services arrive in a timely and safe manner.

For any emergency services (Police, Ambulance OR Fire) call 9-1-1.

VEHICLE INSURANCE & DRIVERS LICENSE INFORMATION

Saskatchewan operates a mandatory vehicle registration and insurance program. When a vehicle owner purchases licence plates, they also purchase a basic package of insurance, which includes coverage for damage to their own vehicle subject to a \$700 deductible. New residents wishing to drive in Saskatchewan must obtain a Saskatchewan driver's licence within 90 days of moving to the province, or upon expiry of their out-of-province licence — whichever comes first. Check with your previous jurisdiction as they may have some restrictions that supersede this requirement.

Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) is the principal vehicle insurer in Saskatchewan. All vehicles previously licensed in another jurisdiction must pass a mandatory vehicle inspection. Please see www.sgi.sk.ca for more info.

ACTIVITIES AND RECREATION

Saskatchewan is rich in geographical diversity. There is an abundance of outdoor activities throughout the province. And, Saskatoon has many different recreational activities both indoor and outdoor for you and your family to enjoy.

Though the Province of Saskatchewan shares a library loaning service, those who live in Saskatoon can utilize the Saskatoon Public Library while those living on base or in the surrounding areas have access to the Dundurn Public Library which is part of the Wheatland Regional Library system.

The Board of Directors is the legal authority for the MFRC and is responsible to the military community. As a member of this volunteer Board, a Director is a trustee for the community and is responsible for the effective governance of the organization. Members of the Board provide guidance, support and direction to the Executive Director to set overall policy and establish the long-term goals of the MFRC. The Board of Directors is comprised of 51% military spouses, and the balance is to be from the military and civilian community. In addition, several ex-officio positions (non-voting) are appointed for their expertise.

Volunteers who wish to be part of the Board of Directors just need to have an interest in the work of the MFRC and be willing to participate in quarterly meetings to discuss current and ongoing issues relating to the MFRC!

PETS

Most municipalities in the area require all dogs and cats be licensed. Detachment Dundurn also requires licensing of dogs and cats while residing on the detachment. The following are the regulations to adhere to while residing within Detachment Dundurn, Saskatoon, and Town of Dundurn:

- All pets must be immunized on a yearly basis.
- All pets are to be leashed except in designated off-leash parks.
- A "Poop and Scoop" order is in effect.
- The detachment regulates pets according to CFHA Para 69; Dundurn allows 3 pets.

Failure to comply can result in fines being levied to the owner(s).

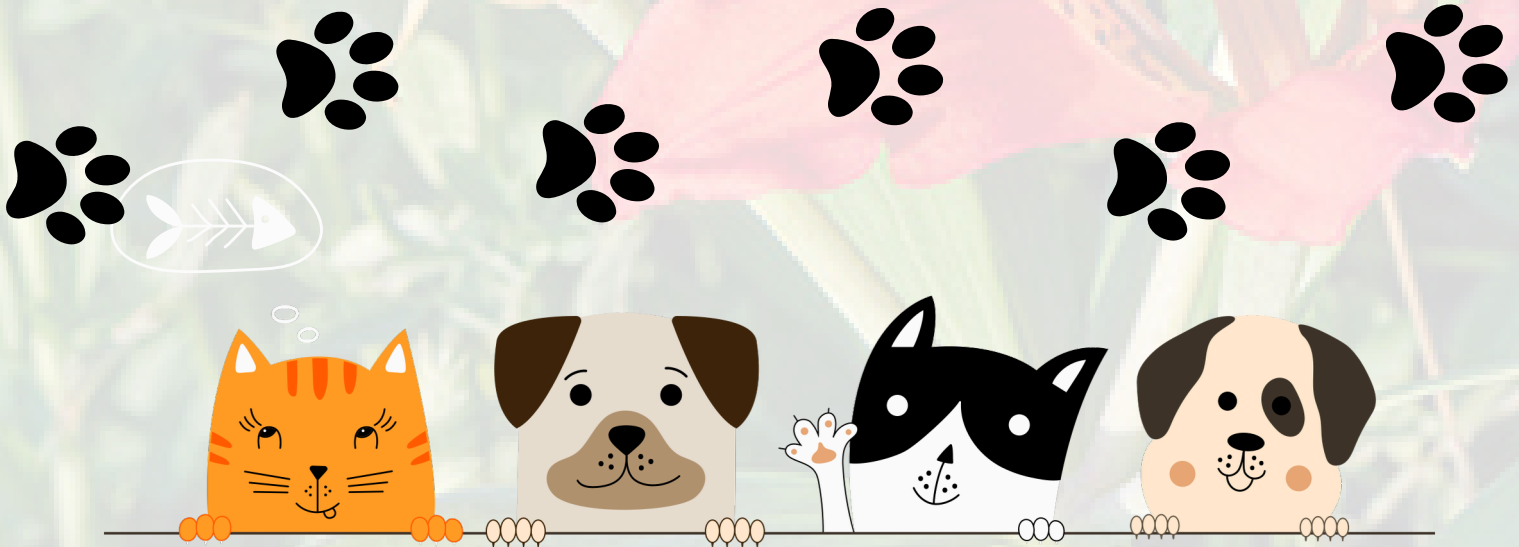

STRONGEST FAMILIES INSTITUTE

With support from the Military Family Services Ottawa, RBC Foundation, Bell Let's Talk, True Patriot Love Foundation, and Veterans Affairs Canada, Strongest Families is honored to provide services to military and Veteran Families across Canada.

Coaches are trained to help families prepare for transitions such as deployments, postings, training courses, and reintegration. They can help equip your family with strategies to cope with change. Programs are for families with children ages 3-17. Services are confidential and delivered when and where you need them. Their free services are available at times that are convenient for your family - no need to travel, take time from work or school. **All staff are trained in military cultural competencies.**

EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

Eligible CAF dependents may collect EI due to relocation following spouse. If a CAF dependent is receiving Employment Insurance (EI) Benefits, it is beneficial to discuss posting and relocation with an EI counselor at your present location prior to moving, complete the change-of-address form as soon as you establish new residency and verify with an EI counselor in Saskatoon that your file has been transferred. Be prepared for a delay during the time your file is transferred to the Saskatoon office.

Employment Insurance Check List

- Military Spouses can receive employment insurance following a transfer. Simply indicate the reason for voluntary departure as "Required to accompany military member (spouse) to new place of residence".
- Check out job search sites within your new community, province and provincial professional orders or associations in your field.
- Volunteer at your MFRC or in your community. This will help you to acquire new skills and experience to include on your resume. It also helps for you to expand your network.
- If you are in a profession whose practice requires provincial authorization work in your area, start the certification process in advance. You can check with your order to get information about transferring provinces.
- Use your existing network or that of your employer to see if you can get a transfer or check with clients or even your competitors to see if there is a branch in your future community.

Timeline of Key Dates

3-6 months before your move

- Read through the entire posting message, verifying location, date number of dependents, etc.
 - Register with BGRS in accordance with the Posting Msg, or contact your Base/Wing Administrator for a Basic Training List (BTL) Relocation, in accordance with the Posting Instruction
 - Schedule individual planning session with BGRS Agent (within 5 days of registration)
 - Enter personal information as written in Posting Instruction (Name, Change of Strength (COS) date, Move #, etc.)
 - Complete Preliminary Relocation Assessment on BGRS Member Secure Website
 - Watch "Navigating your Move" video (must register to have access)
 - Working backwards from Change of Strength (COS) and Report for Duty (RFD) dates, choose preferred dates for House Hunting Trip (HHT) and Travel to New Location (TNL), and request travel in accordance with directive
 - Have a family meeting to tell children
 - Together with your family make a plan, create a **Moving Binder**
- Review finances and outline your budget
Start tracking all your expenses related to the move and organize receipts
- Make appointments to see all healthcare providers and gather health / dental records and fill any required prescriptions
 - Research education and childcare options in your new location
 - Research employment and recertification requirements in your new location
 - Get your pet's vaccinations/records up to date
 - Sell your home or terminate your lease
 - Register for a Traveller Identification Number (Defence Intranet) if you will need travel arrangements

3 months before your move

- If renting, notify your landlord of your intention to move
- Plan your House Hunting Trip
- Make plans for your children and pets during the HHT
- Get financial advance(s) whenever possible from BGRS
- Schedule additional sessions with BGRS as needed
- Start using up items that can't be moved, such as cleaning products and frozen or perishable foods
- Determine whether you are taking a House Hunting Trip or a Destination Inspection Trip
- Go on your House Hunting Trip/ Destination Inspection Trip
- Find a new home to rent/buy

2 months to 1 week before your move

- Update your address / cancel and start services, utilities, etc.
- Give your notice at work, if applicable
- Organize movement of your belongings with movers, pack / load dates
- Start setting aside items travelling with you
- Organize shipment of your vehicle (if applicable)
- Register your children for school, look for a family physician, start your job search, explore childcare options, etc.
- Get information on vehicle licence and registration and health cards, if necessary
- Fill any necessary prescriptions
- Transfer bank accounts and safety deposit boxes as necessary
- Confirm possession date with realtor / landlord
- Plan Travel to New Location, book travel, hotels, rental car, in accordance with CAFRD • Get financial advance(s), if necessary, from BGRS
- Make plans for your children and pets during the move
- Prepare house and belongings for final move
- Say your good-byes, gatherings, visits, etc.



Moving week

- Confirm your moving date and time with the movers
- Supervise Pre-Pack / Pack / Load / Clean See Move
- Defrost and clean fridge, freezers and stove
- Dispose of flammable items that can't be moved
- Give away plants and perishables if they cannot travel with you
- Remove batteries from toys/devices
- Move into a hotel, ensure pets and young children are in care
- Have your vehicle picked up / get rental car (if applicable)
- Final walk through with realtor / landlord, check all spaces, hand in keys

Travel day

- Travel to New Location (TNL) – fly / drive
- Pick up rental car (if applicable)
- Phone Base Traffic at destination to notify them of your arrival (Member)
- Move into a hotel at destination, if required, and wait for a call from your movers

Arrival day and following weeks

- Supervise Unload / Unpack
- Check all inventory being unloaded
- Complete move in cleaning
- File insurance claims for any broken / missing items
- Change locks
- Register vehicles and get your driver's licence
- Register your children in school See Education
- Get new health cards See Healthcare
- Find new doctors, dentists, etc.
- Submit all final receipts to BGRS
