

We invite you to attend the 5th Annual Saskatoon Vimy Dinner, presented by the Concorde Group of Companies, on Saturday April 5, 2025, at the Sgt Hugh Cairns VC Armory. Our guest of honour and speaker this year, is retired Lieutenant General Paul Wynnyk, CMM, MSM, CD who is a former Commander of the Canadian Army and Vice Chief of the Defence Staff.

Since 2016, the Saskatoon Vimy Dinner has been Saskatchewan's premier military event. We are proud soldiers of the North Saskatchewan Regiment, 38 Service Battalion and 38 Combat Engineer Regiment, which are 3 of 7 Canadian Army Primary Reserve units located in Saskatchewan, with soldiers in Saskatoon, Regina and Prince Albert. There are approximately 19,000 reservists across 185 units in Canada. A reserve soldier is very much like regular force soldier except under a few conditions, our service is entirely voluntary and we are able to remain in our home community. While some of us serve in the Canadian Army Reserves full time, most of us are part time soldiers — we are teachers, healthcare workers, public servants, engineers, police officers, mechanics, entrepreneurs, youth football coaches, retail workers and students. Throughout the year we train once a week and one to two weekends a month and depending on how far we want to progress through the ranks we'll take a cumulative of 3 to 10 months' worth of courses across Canada to learn the skills we need. All this training culminates with operations, where we repay Canada's investment in our training through our support of regular force units on operations in Afghanistan, Ukraine, Africa and the Middle East and when we lead operations in Canada's north to exercise sovereignty and throughout Western Canada when natural disasters strike. The out of Canada operations that are lead by the regular force, require reserve force augmentees. We may leave our families and civilian jobs to deploy overseas for 3, 6 or 9 months to support an operation.

Your support of the dinner provides our units with non-public funds that enables us to: provide educational bursaries to soldiers;

continue to improve team spirit through support to the regimental kit shops; preserve our unit histories by assisting our soldiers traveling to Europe to visit our past battlefields; host barbecues and holiday events for soldiers' families; and to support our soldiers or their families in times of great need. Additionally, we will be making a donation to the Military Family Resource Centre Saskatchewan which supports all regular force members and reservists located in SK and their families with things such as child/elder care and youth programming.

More importantly your support and presence will allow us to share our traditions and spend time with our soldiers where you will better understand what it means to be a reservist. The success of the Canadian Army Reserves can only happen if you, our community leaders, understand the value in hiring reservists. Please help us maintain a strong Saskatchewan reserve force.
